

ERRATA

The research brief *A National Portrait of Hispanic Children in Need* and the corresponding infographic were updated on December 8, 2017. A correction to an error in the coding of the “deep poverty” category required small adjustments to several estimates related to that group. We also corrected an error in the written definition of crowded housing. All changes in the brief are documented below, in the order in which they appear:
